SECTION 2 (55 B.C. to A.D. 1485)

- 1. Describe the various invasions of the British Isles by Danes and Norsemen, and state the districts in which they settled.
- 2. Outline the events in John's reign that led up to Magna Carta, and explain briefly the importance of that document.
- 3. Write notes on *two* of the following:—the Romans in Scotland, the Synod of Whitby, St. Francis of Assisi, Alexander III of Scotland, the Black Prince, the invention of printing.

SECTION 3 (1485 to 1763)

- 4. What changes did Henry VIII make in regard to the Church, and for what reasons?
- 5. What were the reasons for the hostility between England and Spain in the reign of Elizabeth?
- 6. What problems faced the leaders of the English Commonwealth during the years 1649–1653 and how did they deal with them?
- 7. Trace the events that led to the Act of Union of 1707, and describe its main provisions.
- 8. What were the problems that gave rise to the Seven Years War, and how were they dealt with in the peace treaties?

SECTION 4 (1763 to the present day)

- 9. Explain what is meant by the enclosure movement of the eighteenth century, and show how far the consequences were good or bad.
 - 10. What were the reasons for the collapse of Napoleon's empire?
- 11. Describe the contributions of Huskisson, Peel and Gladstone between gens jed 1823 and 1860 to making Britain a Free Trade country.
- Egypt 12. Trace the chief steps in the development of South Africa from the Frank Great Trek to the Union Act of 1909.
 - 13. Describe the domestic problems that faced the British government from 1905 to 1914, and explain the measures they took to solve them.
- 14. Write notes on two of the following:—James Watt, Warren Hastings, and the Jacobins, the Combination Laws, the Monroe Doctrine, Count Cavour, Louis Pasteur, the Anglo-French Entente of 1904, Mahatma Gandhi.
- 15. (a) Why is Ireland partitioned at the present day? Give the arguments for and against the ending of partition.
 - or (b) Describe the main stages in the internal development of Russia from 1917 to 1939.
 - or (c) What causes have led to Highland depopulation? What remedies have been proposed?
