- 1. 'All our law relates either to persons or to things or to actions.'—(Justinian, *Institutes.*) Is this the only possible method of classifying the contents of a legal system? Describe any other methods of classification known to you.
- 2. 'My rights are the armour of my freedoms (or liberties) but the two ideas are juristically distinct.'—(KOCOUREK.) Explain and illustrate this statement.
- 3. Explain the distinction between perfect and imperfect rights? What is the nature of rights against the State?
- 4. 'Legal personality remains, in essence, merely a convenient juristic device by which the problem of organizing rights and duties is carried out.'—(PATON.) Discuss this view.
- 5. How would you define the right of ownership? Is it a necessary legal concept?
- 6. Distinguish between (a) detentio (custody or natural possession), (b) possession, (c) bona fide possession.
- 7. 'Of all vestitive facts, acts in the law are the most important; and among acts in the law, agreements are entitled to the chief place.'—(Salmond.) Explain and illustrate this statement.

- 8. Explain the importance of the elements of *iniuria*, damnum and culpa in a civil wrong (or tort).
- 9. On what principles do you think a legislator should decide what acts are to be treated as crimes?
