



#### Notes on the Balfours:

- (1) The last Balfour to live on Westray was Barbara, who owned Chalmerquoi, near the harbour; there's film of us visiting her in 1948. She died in 1959 and Chalmerquoi is now a Bed & Breakfast, with promotional pictures on its website.
- (2) The 'Balfour Family Tree' on the website, by one of the Canadian cousins, lists only those who had children e.g., Francis but not his brothers Fred and William. The full family names are set out in 'Balfours on Westray, Orkney Islands, 1560-1959' on the website, page 13, but the small print is not easy to follow.







#### 10. Who are your cousins?


First cousins share a grandparent,

second cousins share a great-grandparent,

third cousins share a great-great-grandparent, and so on.

The degree of cousinhood ('first', 'second', etc.) denotes the number of generations between two cousins and their nearest common ancestor.

The term 'removed' refers to the number of generations separating the cousins themselves. So your 'first cousin once removed' is the child (or parent) of your first cousin. Your 'second cousin once removed' is the child (or parent) of your second cousin. Your 'first cousin twice removed' is the grandchild (or grandparent) of your first cousin.



Curios from past generations - in the 1930s, it was customary for mothers (not fathers) to acknowledge congratulations on the birth of a child by sending a blue-ribbon or a pink-ribbon card through the post. By 1961, fathers were mentioned as well.


## Prydes - Rosebank Cemetery, 104 Pilrig Street

Follow the green line to the top (west) end of a long internal wall. Count 17 lairs down the inside (south) side of the internal wall. The wording on the stone is:

The names on the map are misleading - they are for the last ones on the stones; the first name on A518 is Thomas Readie and on A513 is Ethel Bradly. There are no longer stones for lairs 514 to 517 (? vandalized) but 515 is 6 feet left of 513 (Bradly) and 9 feet right of 518 (Readie).











